#### **GRADING SYSTEM**

This Festival, in line with many others affiliated to the British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech, has now adopted a new system of categories/grades. Since the purpose of the Festival Movement is education, it is believed that this will make a better use of the Adjudicator's time in providing helpful and constructive criticism with encouragement, both verbally and on the adjudication sheet received by each competitor.

The categories/grades adopted are:

**FAIR** A performance limited in its communication.

**MODERATE** A performance showing development of technique and/or

communication.

**MERIT** A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or

technical ability.

**COMMENDED** A convincing performance technically and artistically.


**DISTINCTION** An excellent performance technically and artistically.

**OUTSTANDING** An exceptional performance both technically and artistically.

As a guide for competitors and teachers, the Adjudicators will base their assessments of these categories/grades on the following criteria:

- (a) security of rhythm and pitch.
- (b) appropriate choices of tempi.
- (c) thoughtful phrasing, breathing and bowing.
- (d) secure, varied and appropriate articulation.
- (e) confident and safe intonation.
- (f) varied tone with well-defined dynamics.
- (g) a clear and precise ensemble with a good balance between instruments or hands.
- (h) good posture and a sense of presence on the platform.
- (i) a convincing interpretation of the composer's intentions.

# **Andrew Padmore**



**Qualifications:** MA,DMus,FTCL,FLCM,LRAM,ARCM,ARCO(CHM)

Andrew studied with Sidney Harrison, Christopher Robinson, Sir Adrian Boult. He has been Head of Music in a large Grammar School, a Cathedral Organist and Master of Choristers, and a Conductor of Choirs and Choral Societies worldwide.

As well as being an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals, he is an examiner of Diplomas for ABRSM.

Andrew is also a teacher of singing who gives master-classes and workshops for singers and choirs. He is a regular Conductor for Yorkshire Voices, and Yorkshire Philharmonic and a guest conductor for Orchestras and Choirs Internationally. He also regularly accompanies singers in recitals and gives organ recitals.

# **Steven Roberts**



Qualifications: MEd,BA(Hons),CertEd,BBCM,CMS

Steven has been a music adjudicator since 2001; has sat on the Adjudicators Council and was Chair of the Board of Trustees between 2014 and 2023. He is a busy professional; conducting, teaching and lecturing. He brings with him experience as a manager, knowledge of quality systems, business acumen and many years of leading change.

He has successfully combined a career in education with his work as a conductor, musical director and adjudicator, working both in this country and in Europe and as far a field as Peru and Bahrain. Steven has conducted numerous concerts throughout this country and throughout Europe with a variety of Choirs, ensembles and orchestras, wind bands and brass bands. He has toured extensively with the Gary Clarke (contemporary Dance) Company for his productions of COAL and WASTELAND.

He studied piano, brass and voice and has worked in a variety of musical settings. He has worked alongside actors and dancers on many projects and is keen to support the work of the Federation to maximise opportunities for performance within all disciplines. He enjoyed working with his colleagues on the Board and Councils and continues to serve the wider community of volunteers that help to keep our Festivals vibrant.

Having previously held the post of Director of External Relations at Barnsley College he has excellent communication skills and enjoys collaborative working. He runs singing workshops for both adults and young people, particularly focusing on Key Stage 1 and 2. He is a visiting lecturer at the University of Salford in the Department of Occupational Therapy, lecturing on presence and engagement.

# **Daniel Chandler**



Qualifications: MA, BMus(Hons)

After graduating from the Royal College of Music (2000), Daniel performed as a professional flautist in orchestras, chamber ensembles and as a soloist. Daniel also has a teaching degree from Edge Hill University (2006) and a master's degree in Educational Leadership from the University of Warwick (2014).

For a number of years Daniel was Assistant Director of Music at Merchant Taylors' School in Crosby and then Director of Music at AKS Lytham. He has conducted choral societies, choirs and numerous other groups in performances across the UK and further afield. This has included directing concerts in Westminster Abbey, Salzburg Cathedral, the United Nations and in St. Paul's Chapel, New York.

Daniel is currently Assistant Head of Bolton Music Service which is the lead partner of the Greater Manchester Music Hub. He works with all sectors of the local community to increase access to quality music making and to support music education across schools and colleges. Daniel is a Professional Mentor for PGCE students studying at the RNCM and Manchester Metropolitan University. He is also a Trustee of Trust Music which is a charity that generates funds to support music education and engagement for young people; particularly those who are experiencing significant barriers to accessing musical opportunities.

Daniel still manages to find time to continue performing, deliver workshops and adjudicate as a member of the British and International Federation of Festivals.

## Fiona McLean-Buechel



Qualifications: BA(RSAMD), CertRAM

Fiona is a specialist strings adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals and has recently been appointed as the Representative for Scotland on Festivals Council.

She has recently taken up a post as Lecturer in Violin at the Royal Conservatoire Scotland, Junior Department and is Senior Tutor for the Dumfries House RCS Strings Project

She is a guest faculty member of the London Suzuki group International Summer School, giving Masterclasses to advanced UK and International students on the course.

Fiona trained at St Mary's Music School (patron Yehudi Menuhin) and subsequently at the Royal Conservatoire Scotland and Royal Academy of Music.

She has enjoyed a highly successful career as a performer and educator, performing most of Bach's Cantata Cycle in the City of London and given solo and chamber music performances at the Purcell Room, Queen Elizabeth Hall, Edinburgh Fringe Festival, with Concerto engagements across Europe and Piano Trio performances for the British Arts Council in Russia and the Ukraine.

Fiona has a passion for performance and empowering others to get the most out of their music making.

Her educational portfolio includes teaching posts at the Guildhall school of Music and Drama Junior Department, Goldsmiths College, Colchester Institute, Cardiff University, Head of Strings for the London Borough of Bexley & Lead Tutor for Strings for Trinity Laban Junior Conservatoire in London.

In 2005 Fiona co-created the Dartington International Summer Youth Programme. This project led to the formation of SouthWest Camerata, a youth string ensemble whose work was nominated for an award by the Royal Philharmonic Society for Education.

Having practised Mindfulness for most of her professional life, Fiona has gained accreditation from the Youth Mindfulness Kids Training Programme and has developed a series of workshops and seminars for Musical Mindfulness, delivering seminars on Mindfulness for Performers and Educators on behalf of the British and International Federation of Festivals at Music EXPO 2016, and the Federation Conference in Edinburgh also at Cardiff University, Trinity Laban Junior Conservatoire, Musicians Union, IAPS, and the Chipping Norton Festival and Music Service inset days.
